

SHINE ON ACTION AWARDS

REQUIREMENTS

Core Requirements

- Projects must be led by an SF resident or SF-based business or group.
- The project must occur in a specific street area or public space the applicant has a connection to (ex: working or living nearby).
- The program or experience must be free to the public.

Additional Requirements

- Feasible and ready to implement In the spirit of "action", we prioritize projects that are poised to start quickly using the resources the award provides. In this case, this means you should be prepared to start events in April 2024.
- Recurring We focus on small-scale, recurring projects that build community, we do not fund one
 time events. For a project to be considered recurring, we are looking for at least 3 events planned
 within the 6 month grant period
- Involving Stewardship We prioritize applications that involve aspects of "caring" for the project site.
 This could be a small act that feels appropriate to the project, from litter pick-ups to weeding.
- Social Benefits We prioritize projects that foster civic trust and reconnect people to each other and
 the public spaces they care about. This might mean that you as the applicant have a specific
 connection to the place or audience you hope to activate, making the impact last beyond this grant
 period.
- Economic Benefits Projects that create economic opportunities for others are encouraged. We are
 particularly interested in projects that provide economic opportunities for SF-based artists,
 performers, youth, people of color, low-income or unemployed individuals, seniors, and/or people
 with disabilities.
- Equity We prioritize applications from Priority Geographies areas where a significant portion of
 residents or people who spend time in the area or location are members of a specific cultural,
 community, racial, or ethnic group that historically has been discriminated against, displaced, and
 oppressed.
- Budget We focus on discrete projects that can be implemented with the \$5,000 award this
 program provides, with no additional funding required. All submissions should include a basic outline
 of budget categories. You can use this template if needed to brainstorm categories and start to map
 out projected costs.

Please Note

- · At this time, previous ShineOn Action Awardees are not eligible for additional awards.
- Applicants are only allowed to submit one project idea per grant cycle.
- The application closes on January 3.
